

2006 Domestic Violence Services in Virginia

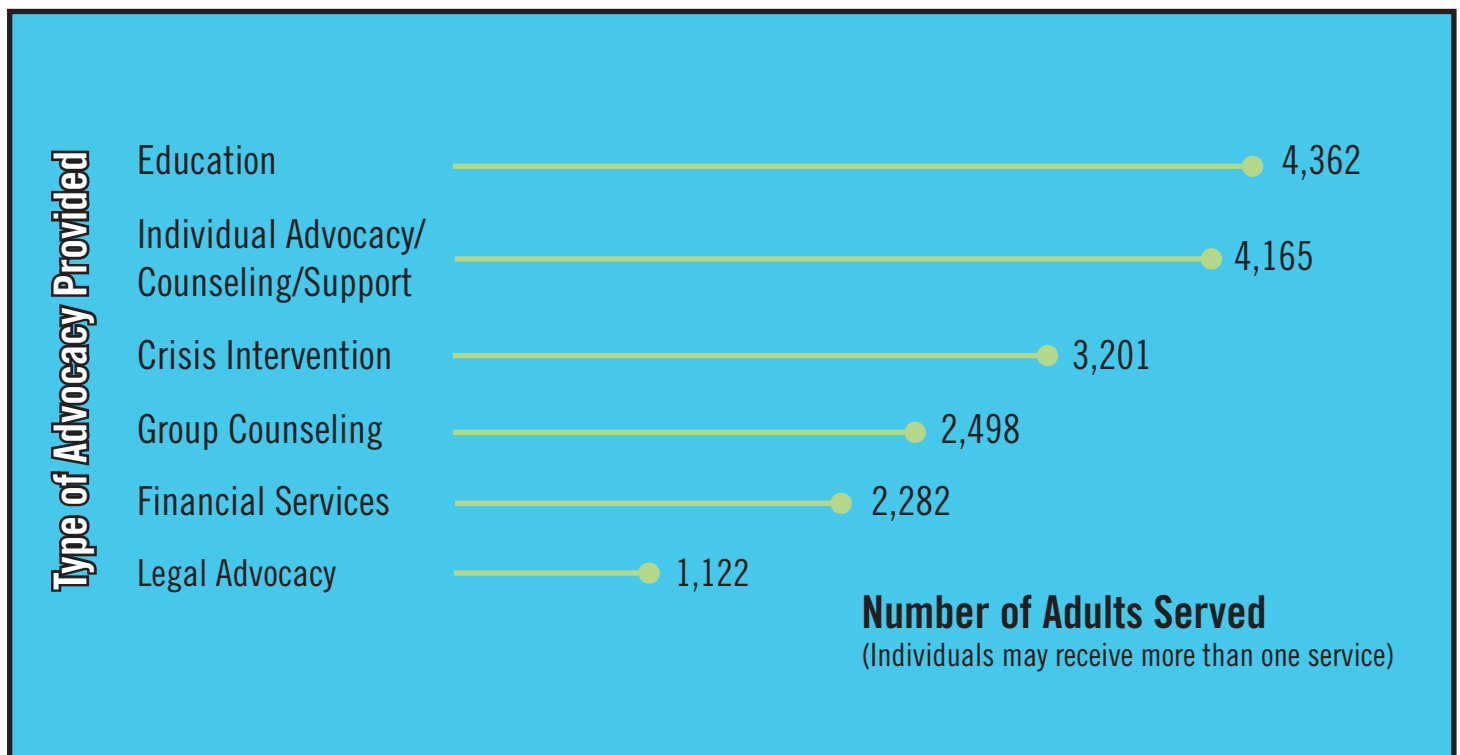
Adult Advocacy Services

Domestic Violence Service Providers provided advocacy services to 5,812 adults in 2006. A primary focus of this advocacy is providing education about the dynamics of domestic violence and the concept of safety planning.

Financial services, including housing advocacy, are also critical to victims seeking services through Domestic Violence Service Providers as more than half had incomes below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

3 in 4

victims reported being better prepared to identify their safety options as a result of advocacy services.

Top 5 Services Provided to Children

2,258	Individual counseling and advocacy services to address the impact of the violence.
1,970	Developing skills, such as safety planning, conflict resolution, communication, and stress management.
1,596	Participation in play groups, field trips, and special events.
1,435	Group counseling to provide information, education, and support.
552	Addressing academic needs, such as school enrollment, on-site education, or tutoring.

3,267 children were served.

43,339 hours of service were provided.

The Impact of Domestic Violence on Children*

*child may have experienced more than one type of violence

Domestic Violence Service Providers spoke with 2,986 children or parents about the child's history of experiencing violence in the family.*

55%	of the children had directly witnessed violence in their family
21%	had been emotionally abused or neglected
13%	had been physically abused
9%	had been physically neglected
8%	had been sexually abused
