




### Safety and Risk Factors Reported By Victims

- 19% of people receiving advocacy services reported the perpetrator used a weapon, including a firearm against the victim.
- 30% of people receiving advocacy services had to relocate or became homeless as a result of domestic violence.
- 51% of people receiving advocacy services reported the presenting domestic violence experience to police.

### Impact Of Services Provided


- 87% of hotline callers reported the services received were helpful.
- 69% of children or their parents received safety planning specific to the children.
- 92% of adults who had at least one identified risk factor specific to domestic violence received safety planning.
