

Generation 5 writes,
" Transformative Justice [is] a liberatory approach to violence... [which] seeks safety and accountability without relying on alienation, punishment, or state or systematic violence, including incarceration or policing."

The **YOUNG WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT PROJECT** defines Transformative Justice as rooted in the "believe that systems can and do cause harm in our lives, specifically harm to black and brown people, (including state systems and social services). As a result TJ works to create solutions outside of these systems."


